NOTES FOR PLANNERS:

Our aerial fireworks can be used just about anywhere, including downtown metropolitan areas.

Distances from Aerial Fireworks

To the Viewers:

70 feet for every inch of Tube Diameter.

The majority of our shows are shot with tubes under 2 inches...

2'' inch Tubes x 70' feet = 140 feet, or 47 yards

Working with Local Authorities

We handle the paperwork related to our work.

To file a permit, we need to give authorities information about the:

- * Date, Time and Location
- * Licenses and Insurance
- * Site Plan
- *Description of Service and Materials

The Site Plan is a simple map showing the position of our effects relative to:

- * Buildings
- * People
- * Public Roads
- * Railroads or Water

The Site Plan is a collaborative effort between the planner, the client and the SPFX team.

Burn Bans

Some counties impose burn bans that restrict fireworks. These bans ONLY apply to "fireworks composed of rockets with sticks and missiles with fins." We do NOT use

such fireworks. Most Burn Bans Don't Effect Us. County burn bans do not prohibit the use of fireworks by professional firework operators, such as Wolf Stuntworks, who are licensed by the Texas State Fire Marshal and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.

Only a statewide ban enacted by the governor can cancel our fireworks.

Pyrotechnic displays conducted by Wolf Stuntworks comply with federal, state, county and city regulations.

Every precaution is taken to provide a safe and enjoyable experiences.
